On Sunday, Jesus began His trip to Jerusalem. He knew that soon He would lay down his life for the sins of the world. As they neared the city, Jesus sent two disciples ahead to look for a donkey with a young colt. Jesus instructed the two disciples to untie the animals and bring them to Him.

Then, Jesus sat on the young donkey. Slowly and humbly, He made His triumphal entry into the city of Jerusalem. Because it was nearing the Passover, there were many people visiting Jerusalem. The big crowds welcomed Jesus by waving palm branches in the air and shouting,

"Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest." {Matthew 21:9}

The crowds were treating Him like a king! Today, Christians celebrate this day as Palm Sunday. It is considered the first day of Holy Week.

Jesus served the Last Supper.

A few days after arriving in Jerusalem, Jesus washed the feet of His twelve disciples as they prepared to share in the Passover. By performing this humble act of service, Jesus was showing how to love one another.

Then Jesus shared the feast of the Passover with His disciples. Jesus knew that He would soon fulfill the meaning of the Passover by giving His body to be broken and His blood to be shed in sacrifice, freeing us from sin and death.

"And He took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, 'This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.'" (Luke 22:19-20)

Today, many churches have Maundy Thursday services to remember this important day and some denominations show remembrance of the Last Supper by having weekly Communion.

Jesus prayed to God.

When the Last Supper was finished, Jesus and His twelve disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed in agony to God, His Father.

"His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground." (Luke 22:44)

Later that evening in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus was betrayed with a kiss by one of His disciples, Judas. Jesus was then arrested and taken to the chief priests and elders. They accused Jesus of breaking the law because He claimed to be the Son of God.

Pilate, the Roman Governor, agreed to condemn Jesus and ordered Him to be crucified.

Before Jesus was led away, soldiers spit on Him, tormented and mocked Him, and pierced Him with a crown of thorns. Then Jesus carried His own cross to Calvary where the Roman soldiers nailed Him to the wooden cross.

Even as Jesus was being tortured, He prayed to God on our behalf.

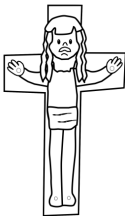
"Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34)

Then after hanging on the cross for several hours, Jesus spoke His last words.

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." (Luke 23:46)

Then He breathed His last breath and died.

We now refer to this day as Good Friday.

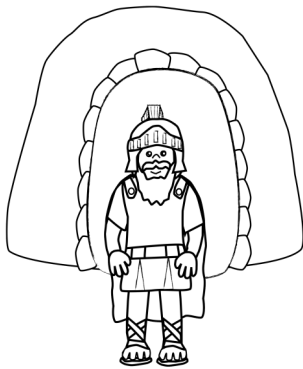

Jesus' body lay in a tomb.

After Jesus died, His body was removed from the cross and placed in a tomb. A big stone was rolled in front of the entrance to the tomb. Pilate placed Roman soldiers in front of the tomb. Their job was to guard the tomb because Pilate was worried that Jesus's disciples would attempt to interfere with His body.

The tomb was guarded for three days. At sunrise on the third day, two women went to the tomb so they could anoint Jesus with spices. But when they arrived at the tomb, the stone had been rolled away! Inside of the tomb, they found an angel that said

"Do not be afraid; for I know that you are looking for Jesus who has been crucified. He is not here, for He has risen, just as He said would happen." (Matthew 28:5-6)

After the angel showed the women that the tomb was empty, with great joy, they left quickly to tell the disciples. But before they found the disciples, they came across Jesus! They were excited but very afraid, but Jesus said

“Do not be afraid; go and tell My brethren to leave for Galilee. There they will see Me.” (Matthew 28:10)

Then Jesus appeared to the eleven disciples in Galilee and He said,

“All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. So you must go and make disciples of all nations. Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And you can be sure that I am always with you, to the very end.” (Matthew 28: 18-20)

After He spoke, He was taken up to heaven where He sat down at the right hand of God.

We celebrate Jesus' resurrection every year on
